Representative Lassa would like legislation drafted that would increase funding for the Retired and Senior Volunteer Program (RSVP) of Wisconsin. RSVP's mission and background information on projects the group is currently involved in are listed below. In summary, Rep. Lassa would like a one-time appropriation of \$537,000 for the second year of the current biennium. As detailed below, the money would provide funding for RSVP's 17 individual county projects at a cost of \$15,000 a project. Four ongoing multi- to current county projects would also receive funding under this proposal, at a cost of \$20,000 a project. To marting addition the Bureau on Aging. The last significant state increase occurred in 1988. At that time, two new state funded projects were added in Racine and Winnebago counties. In October 1997 Rep. Wayne Wood introduced an amendment to the 1997-1999 budget which increased funding by \$88,000 to it's current level of \$502,654. While the effort was much appreciated, it did not make a significant impact when divided by (at that time)16 projects and 28 counties. Wisconsin now has 17 projects serving 29 counties.

Adequate funding for RSVP is important for several reasons:

- 1. RSVP volunteer services in the state reduce the cost of providing human services to people of all ages. Currently over 12,800 volunteers provide over 1.2 million hours of service each year.
- 2. Nationally seniors (age 55 and over) comprise 21% of the population. That number will only increase over the next 20 to 30 years as baby boomers age.

Retirement comes early to many in this age group and RSVP provides an infrastructure to help this group remain active and involved, addressing significant community problems (Independent Sector,

- Where RSVP does not operate, an enormous amount of skill, knowledge and time in the retired population is untapped. The state has an opportunity to utilize a cost effective program like RSVP to capitalize on this resource and to augment services not provided through federal, state and local governments.
- 4. Additional funding will allow Wisconsin RSVP projects to expand volunteer opportunities in many critical areas: mentoring youth, tutoring, drug, alcohol and smoking prevention programs, friendly visiting and transportation services that allow frail elderly to remain in their own homes. Four-county projects would receive necessary funding to address needs in large, rural areas where services are often provided at a higher cost. Single county projects would have the opportunity to expand into a nearby county without creating a new program. Finally, an additional unserved county would establish a program. All this would advance the long range goal of the Wisconsin RSVP Association, which is an RSVP presence in each of the state's 72 counties.


