

1999 ASSEMBLY BILL 912

March 21, 2000 – Introduced by Representatives GROTHMAN, NASS and UNDERHEIM.
Referred to Committee on Education Reform.

1 **AN ACT** *to create* 118.30 (2) (f) of the statutes; **relating to:** prohibiting pupils
2 from using a calculator while taking the 4th and 8th grade knowledge and
3 concepts examinations.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, each pupil enrolled in a public or charter school in this state must take examinations in the 4th and 8th grades that are designed to measure pupil attainment of knowledge and concepts. This bill prohibits a pupil from using a calculator while taking either examination.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

4 **SECTION 1.** 118.30 (2) (f) of the statutes is created to read:

6 s. 118.40 (2r), shall ensure that no pupil uses a calculator while taking the 4th or 8th
7 grade examination under sub. (1m) or (1r).
