Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate:						
Under current law, the Department must collect health care information from health care providers, including physicians, hospitals and ambulatory surgery centers, and must analyze and disseminate that information in the form of standard reports, public use data files and custom-designed reports. This bill eliminates the requirement that the Department prohibit purchasers of health care information data from re-releasing individual data elements of health care data files. If this bill were to pass it is assumed that prohibitions on the re-releasing of data would be promulgated in administrative rules. It is estimated that this bill will have no fiscal effect.
