The Wisconsin Supreme Court held, in State v. Hansford, 219 W (2d) 226, 580 NW (2d) 171 (1998), that a statute providing for —member juries in misdemeanor cases violated the Wisconsin constitution because the court interpreted the Wisconsin constitution as requiring a 12—member jury in all criminal cases, not just in felony cases. Resolved by the assembly, the senate concurring, That:

SECTION 1. Section 7 of article I of the constitution is amended to read:

[Article I] Section 7. In all criminal prosecutions the accused shall enjoy the right to be heard by himself and counsel; to demand the nature and cause of the

accusation against him; to meet the witnesses face to face; to have compulsory
process to compel the attendance of witnesses in his behalf; and in prosecutions by
indictment, or information, to a speedy public trial by an impartial jury of the county
or district wherein the offense shall have been committed; which county or district
shall have been previously ascertained by law. The legislature may by statute
provide that a jury in a misdemeanor case shall consist of 6 persons.

Be it further resolved, That this proposed amendment be referred to the legislature to be chosen at the next general election and that it be published for 3 months previous to the time of holding such election.
