Whereas, Kevin L. Reichert of Chetek, Wisconsin, joined the United States Air Force in 1988, soon after graduating from Chetek High School, where he received the American Tradition Award for patriotism from the American Legion; and

Whereas, 3 years ago, Kevin transferred to the United States Army so that he could fly Apache helicopters, and he became Chief Warrant Officer Second Class in the 6th Cavalry Regiment stationed in Germany; and

Whereas, on May 5, 1999, Kevin Reichert and his colleague, David A. Gibb of Ohio, lost their lives in a helicopter crash during night training exercises over mountainous terrain in northeastern Albania; now, therefore, be it

**Resolved by the assembly, the senate concurring, That** the members of the Wisconsin legislature commend the devoted service that Kevin L. Reichert gave to his country, express their sorrow at his death and extend their condolences to his family and friends; and, be it further
