Resolved, That the members of the Wisconsin legislature recognize that the use of clean burning fuels will reduce ground level ozone concentrations in the monattainment counties; and be it further

Resolved, That the members of the Wisconsin legislature request the Congress of the United States to prohibit the use of MTBE as an oxygenate additive in reformulated gasoline; and, be it further

Resolved, That the members of the Wisconsin legislature request the Congress of the United States to conduct a thorough review of the recent National Research Council report and current EPA rules relating to reformulated gasoline; and, be it further

Resolved, That the members of the Wisconsin legislature request the Congress of the United States and the EPA to recommend improvements to make reformulated gasoline safer and cleaner; and, be it further

Resolved, That the assembly chief clerk shall provide copies of this joint resolution to the president of the U.S. senate and the speaker of the U.S. House of Representatives and to each of the members of the congressional delegation from Wisconsin.
