Whereas, Mr. DeLong served in the U.S. Army from 1953 to 1955; and

Whereas, Mr. DeLong served on the Clinton Village Board from 1958 to 1960, on the Clinton School Board from 1967 to 1973 (serving as its president from 1968 to 1973), on the CESA 17 Board of Control from 1971 to 1973; and

Whereas, he served as municipal justice for the Town of Turtle from 1967 to 1975; and

Whereas, Mr. DeLong served in the Wisconsin assembly from 1973 to 1982, where he was elected minority caucus chairman in the 1975 through 1981 sessions; and

Whereas, upon leaving the legislature, he headed the DeLong Company in Clinton, a business previously operated by his father and brother; and

Whereas, Mr. DeLong served as an employer member on the state Board of Vocational, Technical and Adult Education (now the Wisconsin Technical College Board) from 1987 until 1998, serving as the board's president in 1997 and 1998; now, therefore be it
