I am writing at the request of Representative Peter Bock. He would like to introduce a resolution memorializing the three ironworkers killed at the Miller Park construction site in July.

I am sending this email to you since you authored the resolution honoring Robin Yount earlier this year. If this request should be sent to someone else, please let me know.

What Representative Bock is looking for is something simple: a brief biographical sketch of each worker, a little bit about the risks of being an ironworker, and a commendation to the workers for their participation on an important civic project like Miller Park.

I found a lot of useful information using Badgerlink (www.dpi.state.wi.us/badgerlink). In particular, articles from the Milwaukee Journal Sentinel on July 16 (page 8); July 16 (page 9); July 18 (page 11); July 19 (page 7); and July 20 (page 6). The first two articles are about ironworkers in general with a little bit about the three who died; the last three articles each focus on one particular ironworker.
