

1999 ASSEMBLY JOINT RESOLUTION 100

January 25, 2000 – Introduced by Representatives OWENS, COGGS, GRONEMUS, HAHN, LADWIG, PLALE, PLOUFF, RHOADES, SPILLNER, SUDER, VRAKAS, WALKER and URBAN, cosponsored by Senators ROESSLER, GROBSCHMIDT, HUELSMAN, ROSENZWEIG, WIRCH and SCHULTZ. Referred to Committee on Rules.

1 **Relating to:** celebrating March 1, 2000, as St. David's Day.

2 Whereas, March 1 is St. David's Day, a day honoring the patron saint of Wales;

3 and

4 Whereas, natives of Wales began moving to Wisconsin during the 1840's,
5 settling principally in the southwest corner of the state and in Racine and Waukesha
6 counties; and

7 Whereas, among their early contributions to this state were their extensive
8 knowledge of mining and stock breeding and their musical talent, as evidenced by
9 the popularity of the Welsh Musical Union; and

10 Whereas, a few towns and villages in Wisconsin, such as Cambria, Randolph,
11 Wales, Pickett and Oshkosh, still retain a Welsh flavor; and

12 Whereas, many prominent residents of this state were of Welsh descent; among
13 them are Frank Lloyd Wright; Evan Evans, a member of the U.S. Court of Appeals
14 for the Seventh Circuit; Joseph Davies, an ambassador to Russia; and Peter
15 Houston, the inventor of the folding film roll; and
