7	Yuba; and
8	Whereas, in 1983 the first Cesky Den (Czech Day) celebration was held to
9	promote the Czech heritage; and
10	Whereas, Cesky Den has been celebrated each year since 1983; and
11	Whereas, among the features of that celebration are polka music; the
12	enjoyment of such traditional Czech foods as roast pork, dumplings, sauerkraut
13	rohlike, jiternice, suleke soup and kolaches; a polka mass; various contests; the

wearing of authentic Czech costumes; and the creation of a special button; and
