1999 ASSEMBLY JOINT RESOLUTION 117

March 15, 2000 – Introduced by Representatives Foti and Stone. Referred to Committee on Rules.

Relating to: creating a committee of conference on 1999 Senate Bill 125, relating to operating a motor vehicle while under the influence of an intoxicant or drugs, or both; installation of an ignition interlock device in cases involving intoxicated operation of a motor vehicle; seizure of motor vehicles for offenses related to driving while under the influence of an intoxicant; the prohibited alcohol concentration related to operating a motor vehicle while under the influence of an intoxicant; creating a safe—ride grant program; certain alcohol beverage offenses committed by persons under the legal drinking age; making an appropriation; and providing penalties.

Resolved by the assembly, the senate concurring, That, upon the adoption of this joint resolution by the assembly and concurrence therein by the senate and notwithstanding joint rule 3, there is created a committee of conference on 1999 Senate Bill 125, relating to operating a motor vehicle while under the influence of an intoxicant or drugs, or both; installation of an ignition interlock device in cases involving intoxicated operation of a motor vehicle; seizure of motor vehicles for

offenses related to driving while under the influence of an intoxicant; the prohibited alcohol concentration related to operating a motor vehicle while under the influence of an intoxicant; creating a safe-ride grant program; certain alcohol beverage offenses committed by persons under the legal drinking age; making an appropriation; and providing penalties, to reconcile the differences between the 2 houses, as reflected by 1999 Senate Bill 125 as engrossed by the senate and 1999 Assembly Bill 221 as engrossed by the assembly, and to present its report on the bill to the 2 houses; and

Be it further resolved, That, notwithstanding joint rule 3 (intro.) and (1), senate rules 4 (9) and 35 and assembly rule 40:

- (1) Neither bill need receive 3 readings.
- (2) The committee of conference on 1999 Senate Bill 125 shall consist of 4 members from each house, with 3 members from each house representing the majority party in that house and one member from each house nominated by the minority leader in that house.
- (3) The members of the committee of conference on 1999 Senate Bill 125 shall be appointed by the speaker of the assembly in the case of assembly members and be appointed by the president of the senate, without approval of the senate, in the case of senate members.
- (4) The report by the committee of conference on 1999 Senate Bill 125 must be supported by the votes of at least a majority of the members representing each house.
