Dear Rebecca,

Last summer, you drafted Assembly Joint 58, requesting Congress to prohibit the use of methyl tertiary butyl ether (MTBE) in gasoline. The resolution was never adopted by the Legislature. I would like to re-introduce a resolution to the Legislature at this time to prohibit the use of MTBEs in gasoline. The language for such a resolution is as follows:

Relating to: requesting Congress and the United States Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA) to expedite action on the agency's "Blue Ribbon Panel" of leading experts recommendation calling for an immediate, and significant reduction in the use of Methyl Tertiary-Butyl Ether (MTBE) in gasoline, leading to its discontinuation of use because of public health concerns associated with contaminated water supplies; and, further

Requesting that Congress and the USEPA grant a waiver to insure the use of ethanol in RFG Phase II in the Milwaukee non-attainment area this summer.

Whereas, the 1990 amendments to the federal Clean Air Act (CAA) required the use of reformulated gasoline (RFG) containing a minimum of 2% oxygenate content by weight to reduce concentration of various types of air contaminants, including ground level ozone and carbon monoxide, in regions in the United States exceeding the National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS); and

Whereas, under the CAA, 9 metropolitan areas in the country were designated to be in non-attainment for ozone, including 6 counties in the greater Milwaukee area (Milwaukee, Kenosha, Racine, Waukesha, Ozaukee and Washington), and in January 1995, were required to implement the use of RFG; and

Whereas, in 1995, media attention and public complaints ranging from health concerns, higher cost of the fuel, and decreased engine performance problems prompted EPA to hold public hearings in Milwaukee and assist Wisconsin with health studies related to the use of MTBE in RFG; and

Whereas, in Wisconsin there have been found to be leaking underground storage tanks with groundwater contamination caused by MTBE raising additional health concerns; and

Whereas, Wisconsin has a proud tradition of strong environmental protection policies and is committed to clean air; now, therefore, be it

Resolved, That the members of the Wisconsin Legislature request that the Congress of the United States and USEPA expedite measure to accelerate the USEPA's "Blue Ribbon Panel" recommendation pertaining to the elimination of MTBE use in gasoline; and be it further

Resolved, That the members of the Wisconsin Legislature request that Congress support legislation to phase out the use of MTBE by the year 2003; and he it further

Resolved, That the members of the Wisconsin Legislature strongly support the Congress and USEPA granting a federal waiver to guarantee the continued use of ethanol as an oxygenate in RFG Phase II summertime gasoline required to be used in the Milwaukee area beginning on May 1, 2000; and be it further

Resolved, That the assembly chief clerk shall provide copies of this joint resolution to the president of the U.S. senate, the speaker of the U.S. house of representatives, the administrator of the U.S. environmental protection agency and to each of the members of the congressional delegation from Wisconsin.
