Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Assembly Rule 9. The rule is changed to establish the committee structure and names for the 1999–2000 legislative session.

Assembly Rule 13 (3): The rule is repealed because it conflicts with Assembly Rule 14 (1).

Assembly Rule 24 (2) (a) and (b): The rule is changed to correct a reference to the committee on assembly organization.

Assembly Rule 25 (1): The rule is changed to correct a reference to members of the supreme court. They are referred to as justices, not judges.

Assembly Rule 32 (1) (intro.): The rule is changed to clarify that the introductory language ending with the colon is not independent of the rest of the subsection, but is limited by the rest of the subsection.

Assembly Rule 54 (1): The rule is changed to delete the provision specifying that an amendment is nongermane if it would require a relating clause for the proposal which is substantially different from the proposal's original relating clause.

Assembly Rule 65 (2) (e) and (g): The rules are changed to delete incorrect cross-references.

Assembly Rule 93 (intro.): The rule, which provides for expedited assembly procedures during special, extraordinary and extended sessions, is changed to limit the expedited procedures to special and extraordinary sessions. The rules refer to extended floorperiods and extraordinary sessions. The definition of extraordinary session in assembly rule 95 (27m) covers extended floorperiods.

Assembly Rule 95 (52): The rule is changed to reflect the possibility that, under Assembly Rule 79 (1), both members paired on a vote could be absent.

Unless otherwise provided by the assembly for a specific special, extended or extraordinary session, the rules of the assembly adopted for the regular session shall, subject to the following modifications, apply to each special session called by the governor and to each extended or extraordinary session called by the assembly and senate organization committees or called by a joint resolution approved by both houses:

\*\*\*\*Note: I'm deleting "extended" because the definition of extraordinary session covers extended and because extended refers to floorperiods and extraordinary refers to sessions. See Joint Rule 81. Ok? I don't intend a change, only a clarification. Joint rule 81 doesn't use "extended session". It refers to extended floorperiods and to extraordinary sessions. Joint Rule 81 (2) (c) does not even use the word extended, only special or extraordinary sessions. The assembly rules —Assembly Rule 95 (27m) last sentence reads: "When used to continue a floorperiod of the regular session for a limited purpose, the extraordinary session is referred to as an extended session." It appears to me that extended floorperiods are one type of extraordinary session, and therefore, should not be listed along side references to extraordinary sessions. I advised assembly leadership this session that the extended part of a floorperiod not in the session schedule was treated as an extraordinary session for expedited process purposes, certainly if the extension was for a limited purpose as mentioned in assembly rule 95 (27m). It is not as clear if the extension is of all business without limit.

Assembly Rule 95 (27m) Extraordinary session: The convening of the legislature by the assembly and senate organization committees or by petition or joint resolution of the legislature to accomplish the business specified in the action calling the session. When used to continue a floorperiod of the regular session for a limited purpose, the extraordinary session is referred to as an extended session.
