Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, no person may operate a vehicle upon a highway during hours of darkness unless any required headlamps, tail lamps and clearance lamps of the vehicle are lighted. Fallure to comply with this requirement may possibling forfeiture of not less than hor more than \$20 for a first offense and not less than \$25 nor more than \$50 for a apply or subsequent conviction within a year.

This bill provides that these lamps must also be lighted whenever the windshield wipers of the vehicle are being used, except temporary use to clean the windshield. A person who violates this provision is subject to the same minimum and maximum forfeiture amounts that may be imposed for failure to use these lamps during hours of darkness. The bill also prohibits a law enforcement officer from stopping or inspecting a vehicle solely to determine compliance with the above requirement and specifies that convictions for not having any required headlamps, tail lamps and clearance lamps of a vehicle lighted may not be recorded on the motorist's driving record.

The bill also requires certain vehicles to be equipped with rear reflectors whenever the windshield wipers of a vehicle are being used.

In the performance of their law enforcement duties under this chapter, duly authorized wardens may operate vehicles owned or leased by the department upon a highway, other than an interstate, a state trunk highway or any highway within the limits of any incorporated area, during hours of darkness or at any time a windshield wiper is being used on the windshield of the vehicle, without lighted headlamps, tail lamps or clearance lamps, contrary to s. 347.06 (1) or (1m), if the driving will aid in the accomplishment of a lawful arrest for violation of this chapter or rules promulgated under this chapter or in ascertaining whether a violation of this chapter or rules promulgated under this chapter has been or is about to be committed. Any civil action or proceeding brought against any warden operating a motor vehicle under this subsection is subject to ss. 893.82 and 895.46.
