Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate				
This bill provides that, beginning in 2000, no public school may commence its school term until after September 1. The bill specifies that the prohibition does not prevent a school board from holding athletic contests or practices before that date, scheduling in-service days or work days before that date or holding school year-round.  This bill may result in additional costs for some school districts for heating or cooling and other seasonal maintenance if schools were to stay in session during normal winter or summer vacation periods in order to accommodate the proposed schedule change. These costs are indeterminable. Any additional costs to school districts would need to be accommodated under the revenue limits.  Additionally, current law requires school districts to provide transportation for pupils in private schools. If private schools choose to begin the school year prior to September 1, the bill may result in additional transportation costs if school districts are required to run additional bus lines or otherwise accommodate the transportation needs of private school pupils when public school is not in session. These costs are indeterminable.  There is no anticipated fiscal effect on the department as a result of this bill.
