1 AN ACT *to repeal* 118.15 (3) (c) of the statutes; **relating to:** excused absences 2 from school.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Current law allows a parent or guardian to excuse his or her child from school for up to ten days each school year. This bill eliminates this provision. The bill does not affect a school board's authority to excuse a child from school in accordance with its written attendance policy and with the written approval of the child's parent or guardian.
