Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill creates a restaurant-winery permit, which authorizes a restaurant to manufacture its own wine and to sell that wine at retail from the premises for consumption on or off the restaurant's premises. This permit will be issued by the Department of Revenue and may be issued only for a restaurant in which the sale of alcohol beverages accounts for less than 50% of gross receipts and that manufactures less than 5,000 gallons of wine per year.

The Department's Environmental Sanitation Section in the Division of Public Health is charged with enforcing Chapter 252 and Chapter 254, Subchapters IV and VII of the State Statutes and 6 related administrative codes. The codes cover the regulation and licensing of restaurants, hotels-motels and tourist rooming houses, bed and breakfast facilities, vending of food and beverages, campgrounds, recreational-educational camps, public swimming pools and milk and water laboratories.

The primary focus of the bill is modifications to Chapter 125 of State Statutes, which is outside the scope of the Environmental Sanitation Section's program responsibilities. It is assumed that the bill will not affect Department activities in terms of increased inspection time, additional training needs or modification to codes. The bill has no estimated fiscal effect.
