Alternatively, business may dispose of records containing personal information if the business take actions that kreasonably believe will ensure that no unauthorized person will have access to the records for the period of time between the records' disposal and the records' destruction. The bill defines "record" to include any material on which written, drawn, printed, spoken, visual or electromagnetic information is recorded or preserved, regardless of its physical form. It defines "personal information" to mean information about an individual's medical or financial condition that is not generally considered to be public knowledge. The



At Section 1 of bill, insert the following in the proper location under 895.505 (1)

- (a) "Financial institution" means any bank, savings bank, savings and loan association or credit union that is authorized to do business under state or federal laws relating to financial institutions.
- (b) "Medical business" means any organization or enterprise operated for profit, including a sole proprietorship, partnership, firm, business trust, joint venture, syndicate, corporation, limited liability company or association, that possesses information relating to a person's physical or mental health, medical history or medical treatment.
- (a) "Tax preparation business" means any organization or enterprise operated for profit, including a sole proprietorship, partnership, firm, business trust, joint venture, syndicate, corporation, limited liability company or association, that possesses information relating to a person's federal, state or local tax filings.
