
Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

SUMMARY OF BILL - Current rules promulgated by DNR restrict the types and locations of bait that may be used for hunting certain wild animals. This bill prohibits the use of bait for the purpose of hunting deer during the period beginning on the Monday immediately before the first day of regular gun deer season and ending on the Friday immediately following the last day of regular gun deer season.

This bill also prohibits a person from using bait to attract wild animals more than 100 yards from a residence for a purpose other than hunting unless the person has a permit issued by the DNR. It requires DNR to establish requirements and procedures for issuing these permits and prohibits DNR from charging a fee for these permits.

FISCAL IMPACT - Rules would need to be promulgated. The one-time cost to the Wildlife Management Program is estimated at \$12,500. This was calculated by assuming it would take 500 hours of staff time at \$25 per hour (including fringe benefits) to write rules, hold public hearings and attend Board and Legislative meetings. While it is likely some recreational landowners/wildlife watchers would seek a permit, the number is unknown and is assumed to be minimal.
