Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill requires a health care plan to provide coverage of smoking cessation treatment that is provided in conformity with recommendations set forth in a publication of the federal agency for health care policy and research, as well as coverage of certain specified smoking cessation medications. The coverage requirement applies to both individual and group health insurance policies and plans, including plans offered by health maintenance organizations, preferred provider plans and cooperative sickness care associations; to health care plans offered by the state to its employes, including a self-insured plan; and to self-insured health plans of counties, cities, towns, villages and school districts. The requirement does not apply to health care plans that are offered by limited service health organizations or to health care plans that cover only specified diseases. The requirement may be subject to any limitations, exclusions or cost-sharing provisions that apply generally under the policy or plan.
