This bill makes various changes to the law that requires an unemancipated minor to obtain parental or other consent or a judicial waiver of that consent requirement before she may have an abortion. Enactment of this bill could increase the number of judicial waiver cases handled by the State Public Defender's Office (SPD) based on the following: One provision of the bill would eliminate the authority of an adult family member to consent to an unemancipated minor's abortion. Another provision of the bill would eliminate the option of permitting a member of the clergy to file a petition and affidavit on behalf of a minor seeking judicial waiver of the consent requirement. It is possible that these two provisions of the bill would increase the number of judicial waiver petitions filed by an unemancipated minor, thus resulting in additional cases handled by the SPD. In FY98, the SPD handled approximately 100 judicial waiver cases. If we assume that the number of judicial waiver petitions filed by a minor would increase by 20% as a result of these two provisions, then the SPD's caseload would increase by 20 judicial waiver cases per year. Assuming that each judicial waiver case costs between \$200 to \$300 (these figures assume the private bar rate of \$40 per hour), the increase in costs would be \$4,000 to \$6,000 per year. (Because staff attorneys currently handle the maximum number of cases they can in a given year, any additional judicial waiver cases would be assigned to the private bar.)									
The SPD has no data from which to estimate local government costs.
