
This bill would eliminate the changes made by 1997 Wisconsin Act 283 (known as the "truth in sentencing" legislation) to felony penalties and the structure of felony sentences. By eliminating these provisions of 1997 Wisconsin Act 283, which go into effect on December 31, 1999, the provisions of current law (i.e. the current felony penalties and the current structure of felony sentences) would remain in effect. Retaining current law would have no fiscal effect on the SPD.
