Dear Senator Schultz,

I am writing to ask for your help with a matter very dear to my heart. As my state senator, I was hoping you might consider authoring a bill to make my original song about Wisconsin, "Oh Wisconsin, Land Of My Dreams,"c Wisconsin's official state ballad.

I am almost sure you have heard the song, but let me give you some background information. In the late 1920's, a farm girl from Juneau County, Erma Barrett, took out her journal and wrote a beautiful poem about Wisconsin. In October 1993, I took my grandmother's heartfelt words and set them to music in a song I entitled, "Oh Wisconsin, Land Of My Dreams."c Since it's first performance in November 1993 when Governor Thompson came to Mauston for a grant presentation, "Oh Wisconsin, Land Of My dreams"c has been requested at many Wisconsin events. Each time I perform the song, it is very graciously received and emotionally stirring for many. Performances of the song include: Wisconsin Main Street Ceremonies, Wisconsin State Republican District Caucus, State Republican Campaign Kick-off, Wisconsin State Republican Convention, 190/94 Ribbon Cutting Ceremony, Great Midwest Talent Show, Wisconsin Innkeepers Convention, Wisconsin Senate Swearing-in Ceremonies, Governor's Conference On Tourism, U.S. Army Appreciation Reception, Memorial Day Services in Lime Ridge, Richland Center, Reedsburg, and New Lisbon, 128th ACS Change Of Command Ceremonies, National Conference Of State Legislators, U.S. Army-Fort McCoy Community Reception, Wisconsin State Tourism Reception, Discover Wisconsin Television and Radio Shows, Volk Field Air National Guard Reception, Wisconsin Restaurant Association Awards Banquet, Postage Stamp Ceremonies during Statehood Day at the Capitol, Volk Field Airforce Base Fly-In, Milwaukee State Fair, Concerts On The Square, Hustlerfest, Heritage Days, and The Elroy Sesquicentennial Celebration.

On a number of different occasions, I have been urged by listeners to pursue the idea of having this song become the state's official ballad. The eighth grade class at St. Patrick's Catholic School in Mauston, along with their teacher Mary Beth Crowley, would be willing to participate in the progression of this bill as a class project.

I am enclosing a tape cassette of the song and a lyric sheet. I would like to sincerely thank you for taking the time to consider my song and for any help you could give me in this matter. It has always been a wish of mine to honor my grandmother's memory by having "Oh Wisconsin, Land Of My Dreams,"c become our official state ballad. I hope to hear from you soon!

This bill designates the tuba as the state musical instrument of Wisconsin and requires the Wisconsin Blue Book to include that information.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly,

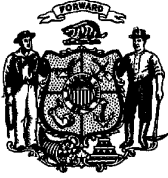
