- (2) The provisions of this section shall not apply to stale bread, provided that such bread be conspicuously marked "stale bread", or placed in a container conspicuously marked "stale bread", and sold as and for stale bread.

AN ACT to amend 98.12; and to repeal and recreate 98.21 of the statutes;

relating to: the sale of ice cream and similar products and the sale of bread.

 $Analysis\ by\ the\ Legislative\ Reference\ Bureau$ 

Current law generally requires ice cream and similar frozen desserts that are packaged before sale to be sold by liquid measure and packaged only in containers with capacities of one—half liquid pint, one liquid pint, one liquid quart or a multiple of one liquid quart. This requirement does not apply if products are packaged at the time of sale at retail or sold in quantities of less than one—half liquid pint.

This bill eliminates the limitations on the size of containers in which ice cream and similar products may be packaged but retains the requirement that they be sold by liquid measure, subject to the current exception.

Under current law, the weight of a loaf of bread manufactured, offered for sale or sold for consumption in this state generally must be a multiple of four ounces and must be at least one—half pound. These requirements do not apply to rolls and similar items that weigh less than four ounces each, to stale bread that is identified as such or to bread manufactured and sold for persons requiring special breads because of medical conditions.

This bill eliminates the limitations on the weight of bread loaves. This bill prohibits a person from manufacturing for sale in this state, offering for sale and sale

of bread unless the bread is sold by weight. This prohibition does not apply to stale bread that is identified as such.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 98.12 of the statutes is amended to read:

98.12 Standard containers; frozen desserts Sale of ice cream and similar frozen products. Ice cream, ice milk, water ices or other frozen desserts of a similar nature packaged prior to sale may shall be sold by liquid measure only and shall be packaged only in containers with capacities of one—half liquid pint, one liquid quart, or a multiple of one liquid quart. This section does not apply if such the products are packaged at time of sale at retail or sold in quantities of less than one—half liquid pint.

SECTION 2. 98.21 of the statutes is repealed and recreated to read:

- 98.21 Sale of bread. (1) Except as provided in sub. (2), no person may manufacture for sale in this state, offer to sell or sell bread unless the bread is sold by weight.
- (2) Subsection (1) does not apply to stale bread if the bread is conspicuously marked "stale bread" or is placed in a container conspicuously marked "stale bread" and sold as and for stale bread.
