

<b>Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate</b>  <p>The current mental health act distinguishes between minors under 14 years of age and minors 14 years of age or over with respect to various treatment. This bill eliminates the distinction. Specifically, this bill permits minors under the age of 14 to petition the juvenile court for approval of admission to an inpatient facility if the parent refuses or cannot be found just as minors 14 or older are allowed to do. Presently, minors 14 or older, who have been voluntarily admitted, must be discharged from an inpatient facility 48 hours after their request. This bill eliminates the mandatory release and provides instead that the juvenile court must hold a hearing on the continued appropriateness of the admission, as is the case with minors under 14. The bill also eliminates the right of a minor 14 or over to file for reexamination, modification or cancellation. Lastly, present law allows a minor 14 or over to have access to court records and treatment records on the same basis as an adult. This bill permits minors 14 or older to have access to these records only in the presence of a person whose presence is required under current law for minors under 14. The bill also permits a parent to consent to have a minor child tested for drugs or alcohol without the consent of the minor.</p> <p>It is impossible to predict the number of new admission hearings that will be requested by minors under 14 or the number of new release hearings that will be requested by minors 14 or older. Likewise, it is also unknown how many modification hearings are presently requested by minors 14 or older and will be eliminated under this bill. The net increase in workload for the juvenile court is impossible to predict with the data available. Any increase in court proceedings requires additional judge, court reporter, court staff and guardian ad litem time. These costs are borne by both the state and the county.</p>
