Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate:						
This bill requires DOT to issue one license plate instead of two plates to vehicles registered under annual (S.341.25) or quarterly (S.341.30) registration which are model year 1968 or older. In addition, DOT must issue one license plate instead of two plates for all Antique plates and for all Collector plates for vehicles model year 1968 or older. The bill requires issuance of one plate after the effective date of the law; the bill allows owners of 1968- and older-model year vehicles which are currently registered and have two plates to remove and destroy one of the two plates. There are currently registered about 93,000 vehicles of model year 1968 and older, in the eligible plate categories. The number of transactions in which a plate is issued are significantly lower. Based on the experience in the overall fleet, we would estimate that about 14,000 transactions per year involve issuing a plate for a vehicle of model year 1968 or older. DOT would incur a one-time cost of 51 days of computer programming, for a cost of \$29,400. DP work would establish an indicator depending on plate type and vehicle age to show that only one plate should be mailed. DMV would then remove one plate from the envelope before it was mailed to the registrant. The additional work to remove the plate from the envelope could be absorbed within DMV budget. Postage cost						
reduction from mailing one plate instead of two plates is negligible.						
Long-Range Fiscal Implications: This estimate assumes DOT could actually undertake DP work. However, DOT's DP staff is extremely limited; and some enacted legislation cannot currently be implemented. This project would redirect staff committed to DP system redesign and other project areas, resulting in further delay in those areas.
