Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate


This bill creates a procedure by which a person may become licensed to carry a concealed weapon. Further, the bill makes it a misdemeanor crime for a person to carry a concealed weapon in a place where the person's license does not authorize the person to do so. Because the bill creates a new crime, it's possible that enactment of the bill would increase costs to the State Public Defender's Office (SPD). Because it is not known how many people would be charged with this new crime or, of those charged, how many would qualify for SPD representation, the SPD cannot estimate the costs at this time.

Long-Range Fiscal Implications

Costs are indeterminate at this time. Agency will monitor fiscal effect of bill, if enacted, for future budget considerations.
