Attached (recovered at great length from the much vaunted AFSCME information retrieval system – piles of paper in my office) is the memo which I thought I previously shared with Bob.

It is possible that I forwarded it by email or put a cover memo on it. But maybe it just fell through the cracks over here. If so, I apologize for the confusion and the delay.

Perhaps a brief restatement of the problem is in order:

- 1. There are significant constituencies that feel underrepresented (and perhaps, are underrepresented).
- 2. There is a pattern of co-optation of "employee" seats by appointment of managerial employees who reflect the interests of the employers more consistently than those of employees.

We would like to know if Bob would like to sponsor legislation of this type, whether he would like to hold talks with the unions to reach an agreed upon "reform" package, or whether he would prefer that we find individual sponsors outside of the committee.

Roy Kubista, AFSCME's retirement consultant, and I are available to discuss any and all aspects of this concept. We are open to enlargement of the concept to other constituencies (we have already speculated on whether there should be a dedicated law enforcement employee seat).

Thank you for consideration of this request.

As you will recall, the directors entrusted us with the task of devising a better scheme of representation for the various retirement boards. There is a desire on the part of other groups to change the current setup. Many protectives feel that there should be a dedicated protective seat. There is also a push for more education sector seats.

Here's the outline of what I've come up with so far:

- I. Wisconsin Retirement Board (15.165 and changes by implication in 15.16/ETFB)
- Change subdivision 3 to read: One member who is a participating employee of a participating city or village and is a represented employee within a collective bargaining unit covered by 111.70.
- Change subdivision 6 to read: One member who is a participating employee of a participating county and who is a represented employee within a collective bargaining unit covered by 111.70.
- Change subdivision 7 to read: One member who is a participating state employee and who is a represented employee within a collective bargaining unit covered by 111.80.
- Add subdivision 10 which would read: One member who is a participating protective occupation employee of a participating local employer and who is a represented within a collective bargaining unit covered by 111.77.
- Change (b) to include (after "Wisconsin counties association..."): The members appointed under subds. 3, 6, and 7 shall be appointed from lists of five names submitted by the governing bodies of the labor organizations determined by the WERC to represent a plurality of employees in the collective bargaining units of those participating employers.
- Employee Trust Fund Board [15.16(1) and 15.16(1)(b)] Π.
- Change "12 members" to "13 members." 1.

- 2. Change (1)(b) 2 by deleting "7."
- 3. Change (1)(b) 3 by deleting "8."
- 4. Add a (1)(b) 4 to read: At least one appointee under this paragraph shall have been appointed to the board under 5.15.165(3)(b)10.

The above adjustments contemplate a process by which state, county and municipal employees are "authenticated," thus avoiding the current abusive practice of appointing management personnel to "employee" positions. This outline also adds a protective to WRB and ETFB.

This is my first pass through the basic drafting instructions. Let me know if the approach is sound or if I've missed something along the way. We want to lave this fine-tuned for introduction before summer.
