Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill provides that if the assembly and senate have not passed the biennial budget bill before July 1 of the odd—numbered year, no member of the legislature may receive any instalments of his or her salary or be paid any in—session expenses to which the member is entitled until the assembly and senate have passed the biennial budget bill. Under the bill, upon passage of the biennial budget bill, the members of the legislature are to be paid all salary instalments and all in—session expenses that were withheld during the period before passage of the biennial budget bill. If the assembly and senate have not passed the biennial budget bill before the end of the legislative session, however, the members of the legislature are to be all salary instalments and all in—session expenses on the last day of the session that were withheld during the session.

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The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 13.121 (1) of the statutes is amended to read:


