Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate: This bill adds to the definition of "farmer" used to determine eligibility for registration as a "farm truck," operating greenhouses or other similar structures, regardless of whether they are used to produce food or farm plants. This definition also is used in determining eligibility for walver of Commercial Driver License (CDL) requirements, as a farmer. It is impossible to tell how many vehicles, currently registered as trucks, would be registered as farm trucks under this bill. We do have information from our database that 17,157 vehicles are currently registered with an owner name containing the word "greenhouse" or "greenhouses." We believe that most of these vehicles are probably trucks, which would be eligible for farm truck plates. This number could be a conservative estimate, because there may be other businesses operating greenhouses. This estimate assumes that these vehicles are all trucks and are distributed among truck weight classes in the same distribution as farm trucks are distributed. Of farm trucks, 88% are registered in the 12,000 pounds and under category; the rest are registered in higher weight categories, with a small percentage in each of the higher weight categories. Farm truck registration is less than regular truck registration by \$138.50 annually for the 12,000 pound and under category, to over \$1000 for the highest weight categories. This reduced registration represents revenue loss to the Transportation Fund. If all 17,157 vehicles were registered as farm trucks, the total annual revenue loss to the Transportation Fund would be \$2.9 million.
