# **1999 SENATE BILL 329**

January 19, 2000 – Introduced by Senators Erpenbach, Plache, Rude, Schultz, Robson, Roessler and Darling, cosponsored by Representatives Schneider, La Fave, Musser, Black, F. Lasee, Reynolds, Young, Coggs, Sykora, Ryba, Wasserman, Boyle, Berceau and Huber. Referred to Privacy, Electronic Commerce and Financial Institutions.

AN ACT *to amend* 40.03 (2) (g); and *to create* 40.82 (3) and 230.04 (16) of the statutes; **relating to:** prohibiting the inclusion of an individual's social security number on certain documents issued or used by the state.

### Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill does all of the following with respect to certain documents issued or used by the state:

- 1. Requires the secretary of employe trust funds to ensure that the social security number of a participant in the Wisconsin retirement system does not appear on any account statement sent to the participant.
- 2. Requires the deferred compensation board to ensure that the social security number of an individual who participates in a deferred compensation program does not appear on any account statement sent to the individual.
- 3. Requires the secretary of employment relations to ensure that no state agency require that its employes record their number of hours worked during any part of a pay period on a form on which the employe's social security number is printed.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

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<b>SECTION 1.</b> 40.03 (2) (g) of the statutes is amended to r	ed to read:
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40.03 **(2)** (g) Shall submit once each year to each participant currently making contributions, and to any other participant upon request or as in the secretary's judgment is desirable, a statement of the participant's account together with appropriate explanatory material. The secretary shall ensure that the participant's social security number does not appear on the statement.

**SECTION 2.** 40.82 (3) of the statutes is created to read:

40.82 **(3)** The deferred compensation board shall ensure that any statement sent to employes who participate in a deferred compensation plan established under this subchapter does not contain the social security number of the employe.

**SECTION 3.** 230.04 (16) of the statutes is created to read:

230.04 **(16)** The secretary shall ensure that no agency require that its employes record their number of hours worked during any part of a pay period on a form on which the employe's social security number is printed.

#### **SECTION 4. Initial applicability.**

- (1) WISCONSIN RETIREMENT SYSTEM. The treatment of section 40.03 (2) (g) of the statutes first applies to statements sent to participants in the Wisconsin retirement system on the first day of the 7th month beginning after the effective date of this subsection.
- (2) Deferred compensation program. The treatment of section 40.82 (3) of the statutes first applies to statements sent to individuals who participate in a deferred compensation plan offered under subchapter VII of chapter 40 of the statutes on the first day of the 7th month beginning after the effective date of this subsection.
- (3) Recording of hours worked during a pay period. The treatment of section 230.04 (16) of the statutes first applies to forms used by a state agency to record hours

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- 1 worked by an employe for the pay period closest to the first day of the 7th month
- 2 beginning after the effective date of this subsection.
