Dear Tom:

Thank you for meeting with us this morning. As we discussed at the meeting, the Municipal Electric Utilities of Wisconsin ("MEUW") is providing language to be added to the cable TV bill that the Wisconsin Cable Communications Association ("WCCA") is proposing. It is our understanding that the WCCA's primary concern is that municipalities may charge its cable TV subscribers rates that do not attempt to recover the costs of the municipal cable system. The MEUW's concern is that WCCA's proposal may preclude MEUW members from having recourse to municipal funds or bonds to construct and operate a municipal cable system.

We believe that the concerns of the WCCA and the MEUW can be addressed by adding the following language as a subsection to section (b) in the current proposal:

Provided that the costs of the municipal cable television system are paid by the subscribers of that system, nothing in this section shall prohibit the municipality from exercising its authority under ss. 66.059, 66.066, 66.069, ch. 67 or any other statutory provisions pertaining to municipal spending or indebtedness, for the benefit of the municipal cable television system.

The statutory references contained in our proposed language are as follows: Section 66.059, Wis. Stats., pertains to public improvement bonds. Section 66.066, Wis. Stats., pertains to public utility revenue bonds. Section 66.069, Wis. Stats., pertains to the use of income derived from a municipal utility. Chapter 67, Wis. Stats., pertains to general obligation bonds.

Again, we appreciated meeting with you this morning and are also pleased that you agreed to add language that would exempt the City of Oconto Falls from the proposal. Please feel free to call me if you would like to discuss this matter further.

Bruce:

- 1. I believe that this amendment captures your intent, namely to ensure that a municipal cable television system does not pass on its costs to nonsubscribers, without prohibiting municipalities from having recourse to municipal funds or bonds to construct and operate a municipal cable system, the concern expressed by Attorney Gallucci. I did not use the language that she proposed because it would not effect the change that you desire. More specifically, the bill already prohibits the subsidy of municipal cable television; the proposed amendment authorizes a municipality to do what it can already do, "provided that the costs of the municipal cable television system are paid by the subscribers of that system" (that is, provided that nonsubscribers do not "subsidize" the system).
- 2. If, in fact, Oconto Falls is the only municipal cable television system operating in the state, the initial applicability provision will have the effect of exempting Oconto Falls from the scope of the bill.
