Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate:

Under this bill, a school board must provide the Department of Public Instruction (DPI) with any information contained in a pupil record that is in connection with an audit or evaluation of a federal or state-supported education program or for the enforcement of or compliance with federal law relating to such a program.

The bill also allows DPI to disclose such information to various entities in connection with an audit or evaluation of a federal or state-supported education program or for the enforcement of or compliance with federal law relating to the program. A person to whom information is disclosed may not disclose the information to anyone else and must destroy the information when it is no longer needed. DPI may recover the cost of deleting from the record information that is prohibited from being disclosed under state or federal law.

This bill is not expected to have a fiscal effect on local districts or on the DPI.
