SUBJECT: Effect of Additional Funding for the Lottery and Gaming Tax Credit

At your request, this memorandum provides information on the effect that additional funding for lottery and gaming tax credits in 2000-01 would have on property tax bills.

For 1999-00, Act 9 converted the funding source for the following six functions from lottery revenues (SEG) to general purpose revenues (GPR):

- lottery program operations	27,927,600
- lottery program operation - basic and bonus retailer compensation	12,178,700
and a natments	226,000
- I and onforcement (DO)	43,300
Leston tax credit administration	15,000,000
- farmland tax seef credit	

The amount available for lottery and garning tax credits is a residual amount that is determined after revenues have been committed to other expenditure items. By converting these functions to GPR funding, an additional \$76.5 million was made available for lottery and gaming tax credits. For 1999-00, an estimated \$212.6 million will be extended as lottery and garning credits, and the average tax credit is estimated at \$167.

For 2000-01, funding for the lottery and gaming credit is estimated at \$109.1 million, and an average tax credit of \$86 is estimated. This assumes that the 2000-01 appropriations for lottery program operations and for Department of Justice gaming law enforcement activities will be funded with lottery proceeds. A partial veto in 1999 Act 9 eliminated 2000-01 funding for these activities.

If the above six lottery functions were funded with GPR again in 2000-01, funding for lottery and garning tax credits would be increased by an additional \$80.6 million, which includes \$79.5 million in converted expenditures and \$1.1 million in increased interest earnings. Total funding for the tax credit would equal an estimated \$189.7 million, and the average tax credit would increase to an estimated \$149. (A larger opening balance for the lottery fund in 1999-00 accounts for the difference in estimated funding levels and average tax credits between the two years.) The following GPR appropriations, totaling \$79,468,200, would be required:

- lottery program operations	\$21,095,800
- basic and bonus retailer compensation	30,573,800
- vendor payments	12,419,000
- gaming law enforcement (DOJ)	226,700
- lottery tax credit administration (DOR)	152,900
- farmland tax relief credit	15,000,000

Finally, you asked about the amount of additional school aid that would be necessary to eliminate the estimated tax bill increase, assuming the additional funding for the lottery and gaming tax credit is made available. Assuming a dollar-for-dollar replacement of tax levies with state aid,

an additional \$280.8 million in school aid funding would eliminate the projected \$108 tax bill increase. With the estimated increases in lottery credit and school aid funding, the estimated tax bill on a median-valued home taxed at the statewide average tax rate would total \$2,016 in 2000(01), the same as is estimated for 1999(00). In total, this would require additional GPR expenditures of \$360.3 million in 2000-01.

Under current law, the general program operations of the state lottery, lottery retailer compensation, fees that are paid to lottery vendors for on-line and instant ticket services and supplies, the farmland tax relief credit, costs of the administration of the lottery and gaming credit and a portion of the department of justice's (DOJ's) gaming law enforcement activities are funded with general purpose revenue in fiscal year 1999–2000. There is currently no funding for these programs in fiscal year 2001–02.

This bill appropriates general purpose revenue to fund the general program operations of the state lottery, lottery retailer compensation, fees that are paid to
