Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate:

Under current law a brewer is allowed to sell beer, for consumption on or off the premises, at not more than two licensed locations. A brewer is required to hold a Class "B" license authorizing the retail sale of beer for consumption for each such location.

The proposed bill would allow small brewers to hold Class "B" licenses for any number of qualifying restaurants, in addition to the two licensed locations. A "small brewer" is defined, under the bill, as a brewer who together with all related brewers produces less than 10,000 barrels (310,000 U.S. gallons) of beer in one year.

The bill would have no effect on state tax collections or tax administration.
