

Current law specifically classifies police officers, fire fighters and various other individuals as protective occupation participants. Under the WRS, the normal retirement age of a protective occupation participant is lower than that of other participants and the percentage multiplier used to calculate retirement annuities is higher for protective occupation participants than for other participants.

This bill specifically classifies teachers and librarians employed at state correctional institutions, secured correctional facilities, the mental health institutes at Mondota and Winnebago, the Wisconsin resource center or any secure mental health unit or facility for sexually violent persons as protective occupation participants for the purposes of the WRS.

Thanks for sending over the drafts on 7/14/99. Sorry for the delay in response, but I wanted to allow time for review by our leadership and the involved local unions.

LRB-3228/1 (DMA Security Personnel at Weapons Facilities) appears to match up with our concerns. We request that it be jacketed for introduction.

LRB-3229/1 (UW Hospital Security Personnel) may require refinement of definitions and duties. There is concern that the unusual employment status at UW H&CA requires some additional clarification. We suggest the following:

- 1. The covered employees should be described as "State Employees Assigned as Security Officers at the UW Hospital and Clinics Authority" (this is to clear up the employing entity).
- 2. The duties enumerated might be better phrased as "...whose duties include direct contact with any person who is a patient, including those receiving services for mental illness, developmental disability, alcoholism, or drug dependency, or who is a prisoner..." (there is concern that there are categories of unruliness/disorder that may not fit the diagnostic categories and incarcerated status outline in the draft, so the introductory catchall phrase seems prudent).

Let me know if these suggests pose a problem or if the drafter has a different way of clearing up those questions.

Thanks for all your assistance and please let Jon know we appreciate his interest.

When jacketed bills are ready I can solicit co-sponsors if you like.

Per your request, this version of the draft eliminates the statutory definitions of patient and prisoner; as a result, the department of employe trust funds will decide the definitions of patient and prisoner.

Please note that in the first version of the draft it was not necessary that the employe only have contact with a patient and prisoner, as these terms were defined; instead, it was only required that the employe duties *include* contact with a patient and prisoner, as these terms were defined. Thus, the employe could be a protective occupation participant under the first version of the with and have contact with other types of patients and prisoners that might have been excluded from the defined terms.

Please review how I have dealt with the issue of where these employes are assigned. I specified that they must be assigned at a facility owned, leased or operated by the University of Wisconsin Hospitals and Clinics Authority. I believe that this would cover every conceivable place at which such an employe would be working.

Per your request, this version of the draft eliminates the statutory definitions of patient and prisoner; as a result, the department of employe trust funds will decide the definitions of patient and prisoner.

Please note that in the first version of the draft it was not necessary that the employe only have contact with a patient and prisoner, as these terms were defined; instead, it was only required that the employe duties *include* contact with a patient and prisoner, as these terms were defined. Thus, the employe could be a protective occupation participant under the first version of the draft and have contact with other types of patients and prisoners that might have been excluded from the defined terms.

Please review how I have dealt with the issue of where these employes are assigned. I specified that they must be assigned at a facility owned, leased or operated by the University of Wisconsin Hospitals and Clinics Authority. I believe that this would cover every conceivable place at which such an employe would be working.
