Dear Kevin:

Thanks for your time during our recent phone conversation regarding TEACH Wisconsin, BadgerNet and the WIAA. As I outlined in our discussion, our new state headquarters building in the Portage County Business Park was completed in June of 1999 and we have occupied and began our normal operations since July 1, 1999. Included in our new facility is space dedicated to a video conferencing studio. Our plans are to use such a facility for educational and instructional programs to our member schools, coaches and officials. We welcome your advice and guidance in pursuing inclusion in the TEACH program and access to the network at the subsidized rate that is given our member school districts, libraries, technical colleges, state university colleges and other educational institutions.

As you know the WIAA is a non-profit, voluntary member association. We have been in existence since 1896 serving the public schools in Wisconsin in coordinating interscholastic athletic programs for boys and girls in an educational context. We currently conduct tournament programs in 21 sports with over 90,000 athletes participating. In addition, over 9,000 contest officials are licensed by the WIAA.

We work closely with the Department of Public Instruction and the Wisconsin Association of School Boards, and have a non-voting DPI representative on our Board of Control and WASE liaison who regularly attend our Board meetings. Our membership unanimously supports the WIAA being part of the BadgerNet and TEACH Wisconsin initiatives and is looking forward to video conference delivery of important educational projects, officials/coaches sport meetings, state tournament information and related topics. The ability to conduct video conferences from our facility will reduce the need for travel to our offices and greatly enhance the efficiency and frequency of our member school communications. We will, of course, assume financial responsibility for connection/start-up costs and annual network maintenance fees and the technical equipment package needed for our studio.

We understand that state statute determines eligibility for the TEACH subsidy for monthly access fees, and we're hopeful you can assist the WIAA in being included due to our educational mission and the nature of our membership. In recent months we have accessed the TEACH web site and spoke with DOA contacts to become familiar with the specifics of TEACH Wisconsin, technology involved and management of the traffic on the video network. Many of our member schools already enjoy the distance learning capabilities they now have and we look forward to similar participation in the future.

We would welcome an opportunity to meet with you or provide you with any additional information about the WIAA. I hope you get a chance to visit our new facility when you are back in the district. Thanks again for your enthusiasm and willingness to help us become part of BadgerNet through the TEACH initiative.


