AN ACT *to create* 77.54 (45) of the statutes; **relating to:** a sales tax and use tax exemption for carbon monoxide detectors, smoke detectors and fire extinguishers.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill creates a sales tax and use tax exemption for carbon monoxide detectors, smoke detectors and fire extinguishers, if those items are for use in a person's residence.

This bill will be referred to the joint survey committee on tax exemptions for a detailed analysis, which will be printed as an appendix to this bill.
