 Senate Bill 412 would require the Legislative Council Staff (the staff for the Joint Legislative Council) to provide staff services for the Joint Survey Committee on Retirement Systems and the Retirement Research Committee. The Legislative Council would also be required to administer a new appropriation under which payment will be made for actuarial studies and opinions and technical assistance as authorized by the Cochairpersons of the Joint Survey Committee on Retirement Systems, the Cochairpersons of the Joint Committee on Finance and the presiding officers of either house. It is anticipated that staffing needs of the Joint Survey Committee on Retirement Systems and the Retirement Research Committee would require the services of 1.0 FTE staff person, at an annual cost of \$47,500 for salary and fringe benefits. It would also require start-up costs for furniture and other equipment for the position of \$2,000, for a total of \$49,500. In addition, a new appropriation of \$15,000 would be created for the Joint Legislative Council for actuarial studies contracted and approved by the Joint Survey Committee on Retirement Systems or the Retirement Research Committee for actuarial opinions ordered under s. 13.50 (6) (am), Stats. The current annual appropriation of \$15,000 for the Retirement Research Director's office for these studies and opinions would be eliminated. Other costs relating to support staff and to administering the appropriation for actuarial studies associated with the staffing function would be absorbed by the Joint Legislative Council's appropriation.
