

Each nursing home may apply to DHFS and receive up to the total maximum amount per patient day for the wages or salaries that DIIFS calculates for the nursing home, under a method specified in the bill. In order to ensure that each nursing home expends the supplement for the wages or salaries, each nursing home must complete a form, prepared by DHFS, to determine if the nursing home's housekeeping, laundry and food workers' wage or salary costs
