I will be introducing legislation that will reinstate prior law and exempt disabled residents from the DNR's annual fishing license application and fee. A disabled veteran brought this issue to my attention. The disabled veteran has in his possession a special resident fishing license issued October 20, 1989, that is effective as long as a licensee is a resident and his or her handicap continues. The veteran found that the law was changed and that only those born prior to January 1, 1927 are allowed to use a special resident fishing license. The disabled veteran was born during 1927 and states "how can you place an age limit on a sick or disabled person." He further states "For certainly its (sic) smells of discrimination." Under this legislation, a disabled resident will no longer need to apply for a fishing license every year and pay a fee of \$6.25. Instead, the exemption will continue until the licensee is no longer a resident or is no longer disabled.

In addition, the legislation will reinstate prior law by eliminating the fee for a one-day group fishing license to groups consisting of people with developmental disabilities and their caregivers. The first bill that was signed into law under my sponsorship was a bill that would allow charitable groups, such as a Lion's Club, to provide one-day fishing excursions for disabled groups. At the time, there was no charge for a single disabled license or for a group disabled license. My bill that was signed into law allows charitable organizations to apply for one group fishing license for a day, so that organizations do not have to apply for many individual licenses. I am appalled to find that effective May 1, 2000, there will be a \$24.25 charge to the charitable organization. The Lions Club that provides this service uses a pontoon boat and the disabled individuals they serve are so disabled that the Lions must bait the hooks, etc. I cannot believe that in the infinite wisdom of the state, we have slapped this organization and the volunteers in the face.

I wanted to let you know I will be urging members to not sign onto LRB 4044/1.

Specifically, I object to your efforts to repeal the group fishing license for persons with developmental disabilities.

Here is how it worked under the old law. Employees at an ICF-MR (institution for adults with profound mental retardation) or at a group home decided to take a group of clients fishing. They needed to go and fill out a license application for each client and write a check from the client's trust account. In addition, each staff member had to purchase a license.

The purpose of this new group license is to allow 1 staff member to get 1 license for the entire group for a day. If you wish to allow charitable groups to get this group permit without paying the \$25.00 license fee, that is fine and would be appropriate for a separate bill. I would ask, however, that you please do not repeal our efforts to make it easier for groups of developmentally disabled adults and their caregivers to go fishing.
