Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate:

This bill would apply current law provisions in s. 118.13, Wis. stats., prohibiting public schools from discriminating against people to charter schools and to private schools participating in the Milwaukee parental choice program.

Local Fiscal Effect

This bill would not change the laws that provide for state payment to schools participating in the Milwaukee parental choice or to charter schools under s. 118.40 (2r), Wis. stats.

Applying provisions of s. 118.13, Wis. stats. to these schools would likely require many of them to develop policies and procedures, and to potentially conduct investigations. This may increase administrative costs, but the costs are indeterminable.
