Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate:		
This bill would require private schools participating in the Milwaukee parental choice program (MPCP) to administer the tests that public and charter schools are required to administer – the Wisconsin Reading and Comprehension Test		
(WRCT or 3 <sup>rd</sup> grade reading test), the Knowledge and Concept Examinations (WKCE) in the 4 <sup>th</sup> , 8 <sup>th</sup> and 10 <sup>th</sup> grades,		
and the high school graduation examination.		
For purposes of this estimate, current year numbers have been used. In 1999-2000, there are estimated to be 8,104		
pupils (headcount) in the MPCP. Of those, 751 pupils are in the 3 <sup>rd</sup> grade, 696 in the 4 <sup>th</sup> grade, 463 in the 8 <sup>th</sup> grade,		
177 in the 10 <sup>th</sup> grade, 105 in the 11 <sup>th</sup> grade and 64 in the 12 <sup>th</sup> grade. Therefore, the total number of students that could		
be tested is 2,256. Assuming each student took the appropriate test and took it only once this year, and assuming an administration cost of \$10 per student for the WRCT and WKCE and \$11 per student for the high school graduation		
examination, the total cost would be approximately \$22,800. Funding for the WRCT in the amount of \$7,500 would		
have to be drawn from the s. 20.255 (1) (a) appropriation and funding for the WKCE and the high school graduation examination in the amount of \$15,300 would have to be drawn from the s. 20.255 (1) (dw) appropriation.

The bill also requires charter schools and schools participating in MPCP to comply with the state's open meetings and		
public records laws. Additional costs to the state and to the schools would be based on individual acts of noncompliance. The number and nature of those acts cannot be predicted, therefore the costs are indeterminable.
