

1999 SENATE BILL 478

March 16, 2000 – Introduced by Senators SHIBILSKI, COWLES and CLAUSING, cosponsored by Representatives JOHNSRUD, HUBER, VRAKAS and HASENOHRL. Referred to Committee on Agriculture, Environmental Resources and Campaign Finance Reform.

1 **AN ACT** *to repeal* 281.70 (6); *to amend* 281.70 (3) (a); and *to create* 20.370 (1)
2 (hv), 23.0925, 281.69 (3) (b) 5., 281.69 (3) (b) 6., 281.69 (3) (b) 7. and 281.69 (3)
3 (b) 8. of the statutes; **relating to:** the maintenance and development of habitat
4 areas, all-terrain vehicle gas tax payments, river protection grant amounts,
5 rules for river grant eligibility, rules for lake management project grants and
6 making appropriations.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, the department of natural resources (DNR) provides grants for certain projects relating to lakes including lake management projects that improve or protect the quality of water in lakes or the natural ecosystems of lakes. Current law requires DNR to promulgate rules designating those activities for which a grant may be provided. This bill requires DNR to designate certain additional activities for which a grant may be provided.

Under current law, DNR also provides grants for management projects and planning projects relating to rivers. Current law provides that a grant for a planning project may not exceed \$10,000. This bill increases the limit for such a grant to \$25,000. Current law also requires DNR to promulgate rules establishing the types of natural riverine ecosystems that are eligible for river planning or management project grants. This bill eliminates that requirement.

This bill also appropriates funds to maintain and develop certain habitat areas and increases funding for hunting and fishing promotion, for certain DNR positions,

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1 expended by a private organization to maintain or develop any of those habitat areas,
2 the department expends \$1.

3 **SECTION 4.** 281.69 (3) (b) 5. of the statutes is created to read:

4 281.69 (3) (b) 5. Education and demonstration activities for landowners,
5 landscape contractors and officials of local governmental units, as defined in s.
6 66.299 (1) (a), relating to shoreland restoration areas and vegetative buffer areas on
7 lake shores.

8 **SECTION 5.** 281.69 (3) (b) 6. of the statutes is created to read:

9 281.69 (3) (b) 6. The development of shoreland restoration plans.

10 **SECTION 6.** 281.69 (3) (b) 7. of the statutes is created to read:

11 281.69 (3) (b) 7. The preparation and distribution of technical assistance
12 materials relating to lake management practices.

13 **SECTION 7.** 281.69 (3) (b) 8. of the statutes is created to read:

14 281.69 (3) (b) 8. The purchase, distribution and placement of native shoreland
15 plants by landowners.

16 **SECTION 8.** 281.70 (3) (a) of the statutes, as created by 1999 Wisconsin Act 9,
17 is amended to read:

18 281.70 (3) (a) A grant for a planning project may be made for up to 75% of the
19 cost of the project but may not exceed \$10,000 \$25,000 per grant.

20 **SECTION 9.** 281.70 (6) of the statutes, as created by 1999 Wisconsin Act 9, is
21 repealed.

22 **SECTION 10. Nonstatutory provisions.**

23 (1) Notwithstanding section 16.42 (1) (e) of the statutes, in submitting
24 information under section 16.42 of the statutes for purposes of the 2001–03 biennial
25 budget bill, the department of natural resources shall submit information

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1 concerning the appropriation under section 20.370 (5) (cq) of the statutes as though
2 the increase in the dollar amount of that appropriation by SECTION 11 (6) of this act
3 had not been made.

4 (2) Notwithstanding section 16.42 (1) (e) of the statutes, in submitting
5 information under section 16.42 of the statutes for purposes of the 2001–03 biennial
6 budget bill, the department of natural resources shall submit information
7 concerning the appropriation under section 20.370 (7) (fs) of the statutes as though
8 the increase in the dollar amount of that appropriation by SECTION 11 (8) of this act
9 had not been made.

10 **SECTION 11. Appropriation changes.**

11 (1) WILDLIFE BIOLOGIST AND TECHNICIAN POSITIONS. In the schedule under section
12 20.005 (3) of the statutes for the appropriation to the department of natural
13 resources under section 20.370 (1) (mu) of the statutes, as affected by the acts of 1999,
14 the dollar amount is increased by \$86,000 for fiscal year 2000–01 to increase the
15 authorized FTE positions for the department by 2.0 SEG wildlife biologist and
16 technician positions.

17 (2) HUNTING AND FISHING PROMOTION. In the schedule under section 20.005 (3)
18 of the statutes for the appropriation to the department of natural resources under
19 section 20.370 (1) (mu) of the statutes, as affected by the acts of 1999, the dollar
20 amount is increased by \$50,000 for fiscal year 2000–01 to provide funding to promote
21 activities related to making hunting and fishing opportunities more available to the
22 public.

23 (3) CONSERVATION WARDEN POSITIONS. In the schedule under section 20.005 (3)
24 of the statutes for the appropriation to the department of natural resources under
25 section 20.370 (3) (as) of the statutes, as affected by the acts of 1999, the dollar

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1 amount is increased by \$316,500 for fiscal year 2000–01 to increase the authorized
2 FTE positions for the department by 4.0 SEG conservation warden positions.

3 (4) STATEWIDE RIVERS COORDINATOR POSITION. In the schedule under section
4 20.005 (3) of the statutes for the appropriation to the department of natural
5 resources under section 20.370 (4) (aq) of the statutes, as affected by the acts of 1999,
6 the dollar amount is increased by \$50,800 for fiscal year 2000–01 to increase the
7 authorized FTE positions for the department by 1.0 SEG statewide rivers
8 coordinator position.

9 (5) FISHERIES BIOLOGIST AND TECHNICIAN POSITIONS. In the schedule under section
10 20.005 (3) of the statutes for the appropriation to the department of natural
11 resources under section 20.370 (4) (mu) of the statutes, as affected by the acts of 1999,
12 the dollar amount is increased by \$103,200 for fiscal year 2000–01 to increase the
13 authorized FTE positions for the department by 2.0 SEG fisheries biologist and
14 technician positions.

15 (6) RECREATIONAL BOATING AND OTHER PROJECTS. In the schedule under section
16 20.005 (3) of the statutes for the appropriation to the department of natural
17 resources under section 20.370 (5) (cq) of the statutes, as affected by the acts of 1999,
18 the dollar amount is increased by \$500,000 for fiscal year 2000–01 to increase
19 funding for the purposes for which the appropriation is made.

20 (7) LAKE MANAGEMENT GRANTS. In the schedule under section 20.005 (3) of the
21 statutes for the appropriation to the department of natural resources under section
22 20.370 (6) (ar) of the statutes, as affected by the acts of 1999, the dollar amount is
23 increased by \$850,000 for fiscal year 2000–01 to increase funding for the purposes
24 for which the appropriation is made.
