SB 479 seeks to put requirements on school boards concerning the use of pesticides in schools and on school grounds. Each board must implement a pest management plan designed to prevent unacceptable levels of pest activity while minimizing hazards to persons, property and the environment.								
The bill states that the University of Wisconsin System, through UW-Extension, must provide programs to educate and train employees of school districts and others about developing and implementing school pest management plans. To accomplish this, Extension would setup and run six integrated pest management (IPM) seminars as well as four workshops for pesticide application training and certification. The total cost for these 10 events including pay for the pest management specialists, supplies, travel costs, administrative costs, and a survey to determine current pest management practices of school districts would amount to \$92,000.								
Note that this figure represents a first year estimate only. Subsequent training for new employees or vendors employed by school districts as well as any recertification requirements cannot be assessed without the numbers of people who may need new training (after the first year) or recertification.								
In addition, it should be noted that the Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection (DATCP) is considering creating a new level of certification for school pest management if the bill passes. If this is done, UW-Extension would incur additional one-time costs of approximately \$35,000 to develop a new curriculum and training materials.
