

Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate Conclusion: State Costs: One-time \$54,870; on-going annualized \$241,056. Local Costs: None		
Basis for Conclusion: 1. Costs to change the design of the driver license: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The back of the current driver license allows a little less than 1½" of laminated area for the magnetic stripe, driver license class and restriction information. Below that, about ½" of un-laminated area is used for the current "Anatomical Gift Statement" label, donation choices, and signature. Changing the label to the longer Organ Donor and Tissue Donation Statement, and adding the words Wisconsin Donor Registry and 1-800-XXX-XXXX will require careful re-formatting. To fit the changes into the existing space, and still have room for the signature, the print size will probably be too small to read easily. • If the size of the un-laminated area is increased, the resulting smaller restriction area will cause more frequent issue of a second card to complete the driver license restriction information. For example, an estimated 125,000 second cards will be generated to add GDL restrictions for young drivers. Many occupational licenses already generate a second card; some additional second cards would be generated for occupationals • The current cost of a card is about \$1.03; the new contract cost will be about \$1.18. The vendor also requires a minimum of \$10,000 for re-programming the layout. These costs will be covered by the Wisconsin Donor Registry. 2. Costs for WisDOT staff: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Nearly 30% of drivers answer the organ donor question affirmatively, but <u>all</u> applicants must be provided with the registry form and be told that enrollment in the Registry is not required to make an anatomical gift. Assume 30 seconds to provide the forms(s) and answer questions. In 1999 there were 1,227,944 driver license transactions at Customer Service Centers. (1,227,944 x 30 seconds = 10,232 hours. (10,232 hours / 1,725 = 6 FTE) Classification is Transportation Customer Representative 4 - Field @ \$12.928 minimum (99-00 WSEU contract) = \$221,400 including 37.14% fringe. • One time Supplies and Services costs for a BFS (Customer Service Center) FTE are \$9,145; ongoing costs per FTE are \$3,276. One-time = \$54,870; on-going \$19,656 annually.

3. The proposal specifies that registry form be designed and maintained by the Wisconsin Donor Registry. WisDOT expects the on-going costs for the form supply will also be covered by the Wisconsin Donor Registry. (By statute, the "donor dots" form is currently provided to WisDOT by the Wisconsin Organ Procurement Organizations.)
4. If the new registry form is combined onto the "donor dots" form sent by WisDOT with driver renewal notices, there should be no additional postage costs. (Currently from 1 to 5 inserts are sent with the renewal form.) If the enrollment form is designed as a separate document from the "donor dot" form, there may be additional postage costs for some renewal mailings. About 900,000 renewals are mailed each year. Additional postage costs will be covered by the Wisconsin Donor Registry.
5. WisDOT will develop the programming to provide the electronic names and addresses from the driver license file of applicants who answered affirmatively to the organ donor question, to the Wisconsin Donor Registry. The data will be downloaded 4 times a year, onto magnetic media provided by the Wisconsin Donor Registry. One time costs to develop the programming = 3 hours @ \$16.052 (ISC Comp professional - Senior) and computer costs of about \$60 = \$108. On-going costs to provide the data quarterly are negligible


