I received comments regarding the previous version of this draft from Dave Stute, Bob Lang and Bruce Munson. This draft reflects the changes suggested by them.

Please review the attached preliminary draft, setting forth a 1997–1998 session schedule based on the session schedule enacted by 1995 SJR–1 for the 1995–1996 biennium with modifications to shorten the session because of the experience this session that resulted in passage of 1995 AJR 95. They provide, like 1994, for the last general—business floorperiod to be held in March 1998, that no proposal may be introduced after March 26, 1998, and for a veto review session to be held in May 1998, but also provide, like 1996, that the consideration of some bills and joint resolutions carries over to May 1998. The bills and joint resolutions that carry over are those that are being considered by a committee of conference and those that have been passed by and concurred in by the 2nd house, but amendments are still pending. The May floorperiod is created to permit the legislature to consider differences between the houses, but not proposals that had passed only one or neither house as of March 26, 1998, as well as business permitted during a veto review floorperiod.

For review and comment by JCLO cochairpersons, majority and minority leaders and Joint Committee on Finance cochairpersons:

This preliminary 1999–2000 session schedule establishes the same weeks as the 1997–1998 session schedule, and just updates the dates to conform to the dates in 1999 and 2000. What changes need to be made?

The March 1999 floorperiod is scheduled at the same time as the UW-Madison spring break. Do you wish to reschedule it?

Yom Kipper (Monday, September 20) falls during the September 1999 floorperiod. OK? Martin Luther King Day (Monday, January 17) falls during the January 2000 floorperiod. OK?

Ash Wednesday (Wednesday, March 8) and the UW-Madison spring recess (March 11 to 19) fall during the March 2000 floorperiod. Do you wish to reschedule it?

The constitution and statutes require only one meeting in each January. Do you wish to delete the mid–January meeting in 1999?

This preliminary schedule permits the governor to submit the budget as late as February 10, 1999, rather than January 26, 1999. By agreeing to the delay, the legislature gives the governor 2 more weeks of LRB drafting time and takes the 2 weeks away from legislators, as well as takes the 2 weeks away from the joint committee on finance and the LFB. OK?

The mid-September, 1995, fall floorperiod was too early for some legislation that wasn't submitted to the LRB until after the budget was signed in August. In several cases in 1995, a fairly complicated bill could not be drafted, introduced, heard and reported out of both the subject committee and rules committee before October. Do you wish to postpone the start of the September 1999 floorperiod by 1 or 2 weeks?

Holding the veto review period in the last week of April 1998, rather than in mid May, made it impossible for the LRB to prepare one veto brief containing all of the governor's vetoes and for the revisor to prepare correction bills for enactment at the session. Do you wish to reschedule it to mid or late May?

Does the November 1999 floorperiod need to be lengthened so that more legislation can pass at least one house then, rather than forcing most to pass 2 houses in the Spring of 2000?

In 1993, the Governor delivered his state-of-the-state address on Tuesday, January 26, 1993, and his budget message on Thursday, February 4, 1993. In 1995, the governor delivered his state-of-the-state address on Wednesday, January 25, 1995, and his budget message on February 14, 1995. In 1996, he delivered his state-of-the-state address on Tuesday, January 30, 1996. In 1997, he delivered his state-of-the-state address on Wednesday, January 29, 1997, and his budget message on Wednesday, February 12, 1997. In 1998, he delivered his state-of-the-state address on Tuesday, January 20, 1998. Do you want to change the schedule to require a different date for either message?
