Ken-Here is my first attempt at your issue. This approach would climinate the need for some, but not all, special and extraordinary session adjournment resolutions by building their content into the session schedule. If someone wanted a change to something in this new subsection, they would still need an adjournment resolution. We would need to change the title to the last paragraph of subsection (2) in the session schedule from "Last bill to governor." to "Bills to governor."; renumber subsection (4) to subsection (5); and create the following new subsection (4):

"(4) SPECIAL AND EXTRAORDINARY SESSIONS. (a) Adjournment. Except for consideration of executive vetoes or partial vetoes, a motion adopted in each house to adjourn a special or extraordinary session pursuant to this joint resolution shall constitute final adjournment of the special or extraordinary session.

- (b) Bills to governor. No later than 4:30 p.m. on the Thursday occurring 2 full weeks after the day of final adjournment of a special or extraordinary session, the chief clerk of each house shall submit to the governor for executive action thereon any enrolled bill passed by both houses after May (2000, and originating in the chief clerk's house during the special or extraordinary session.
- (c) Veto review. A special or extraordinary session shall reconvene upon a call of a majority of the members of the joint committee on legislative organization solely for the consideration of executive vetoes or partial vetoes if an enrolled bill passed by both houses during the special or extraordinary session was vetoed or partially vetoed on or after the first day of the veto review floorperiod.

The joint committee on legislative organization is required by s. 13.02(3), stats., and by joint rule 81(1) to develop a proposed session schedule early in each biennial session period. This session schedule must "include at least one meeting in January of each year" to implement the "annual sessions" intent, and is "to be submitted to the legislature" for approval in the form of a joint resolution.

Under joint rule 81 (2), by majority action of the 2 houses or of the organization committees of the 2 houses, any floorperiod may be convened earlier than its scheduled convening date or may be extended beyond its scheduled ending date. Under this joint resolution, by majority action of the 2 houses, any floorperiod other than the floorperiod that commences on June 1, 1999, may be adjourned earlier than its scheduled ending date; that floorperiod is not authorized to be adjourned until the general fund executive budget bill has passed both houses.

Under joint rule 83 (2), during the periods of committee work preceding the final general-business floorperiod (the floorperiod that commences on May 2, 2000), bills, resolutions and amendments may be introduced.

Under joint rule 83 (4), May 4,2000, is the day on which proposals die for the session, except proposals that have been passed by one house and concurred in, as amended, by the other house, unless the legislature, by joint resolution, extends the floorperiod that commences on May 2, 2000, and enumerates the proposals to be carried forward for consideration during the extension.

Under joint rule 83 (5), no new proposals (except proposals pertaining to a veto review session or to any special or extraordinary session) may be introduced after May 4, 2000.

The joint resolution also contains a schedule for special and extraordinary sessions regarding adjournment, submission of bills to the governor and veto review.

Resolved by the senate, the assembly concurring, That:

SECTION 1. 1999–2000 Session schedule. (1) BIENNIAL SESSION PERIOD. The legislature declares that the biennial session period of the 1999 Wisconsin legislature began on Monday, January 4, 1999, and that the biennial session period ends at 12 noon on Monday, January 1, 2001.

- (3) Interim period of committee work, no further introductions. Upon the adjournment of the May veto review floorperiod, there shall be an interim period of committee work ending on Monday, January 1, 2001. Unless the legislature is convened in one or more extraordinary or special sessions, no additional 1999 legislation may be offered during this interim period of committee work.
- (4) END OF TERM. The biennial term of the 1999 legislature ends on the first Monday of January (January 1) in 2001. Pursuant to section 13.02 (1) of the statutes,

1	the inauguration of the members of the 2001 legislature will be on Wednesday,
2	January 3, 2001.
3	SECTION 2. Notice of 2001 session organization. Notice is hereby given that
4	the biennial session of the 2001 legislature will hold its first meeting, pursuant to
5	section 13.02 (1) of the statutes, on Wednesday, January 3, 2001, and that the
6	meeting will begin at 2 p.m.
