I am writing to request that you draft a Senate Joint Resolution proclaiming May 3<sup>rd</sup>, Trzeciego Maja Day in Wisconsin.

This would be a permanent proclamation, so that we do not need to revisit this issue every year. As you may remember, the Senate failed to take up the resolution last year. Therefore, you may have to make some necessary modifications to the resolution in order to make the proclamation permanent.

"Trzeciego Maja" (pronounced Tra-jek-e My-o) is Polish for May 3. On this date in 1791, the Polish Constitution was signed. The day is now celebrated as Polish Constitution Day.

In honor of the late Senator John Plewa, <u>LRB-4903</u> has been drafted using the same language John used in previous "Trzeciego Maja" resolutions that he introduced while serving in the Wisconsin State Legislature.
