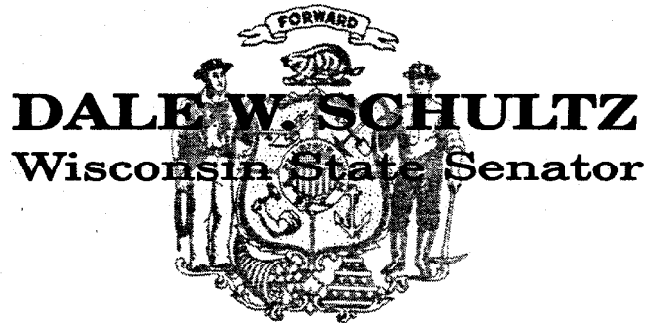
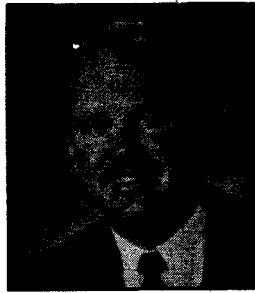

Attached find a rough draft of the suggested language for a Senate Joint Resolution on Language for Interstate Shipment of State Inspected Meat.

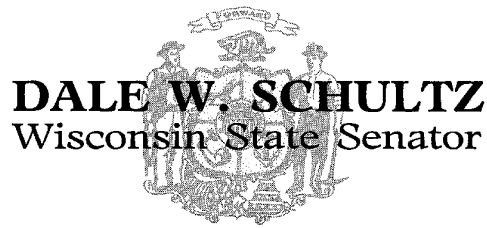
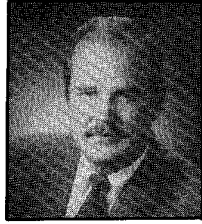

RE: Joint Resolution Language for Interstate Shipment of State Inspected Meat

Relating to: Memorializing Congress to amend 21 U.S.C. 661 (a) to allow for the interstate shipment of state-inspected meat.

Whereas, currently, state inspected beef, pork and poultry are banned from crossing state lines, while state inspected ostrich, venison, buffalo and pheasants are allowed across state lines; and

Whereas, foreign meat products may move freely among the states; and

Whereas, Wisconsin has one hundred small state-inspected slaughtering establishments, none of which are allowed to market products in interstate commerce due to an outdated federal law; and

Whereas, Wisconsin and the United States are currently suffering from a national hog market crisis including a closure of packing facilities and a reduction in slaughter activity due in part to these outdated interstate restrictions and;

Whereas, 21 U.S.C. 661 (a) being outdated, is restricting the opportunity for these small plants to expand their markets across state lines, provide additional slaughter capacity for pork producers and increase the demand for their products now, therefore be it.

Resolved by the Senate, the Assembly concurring, That Congress is requested to address this issue related to the meat-processing industry concerning packing, processing and marketing capacities; and be it further

Resolved, That the members of the Wisconsin legislature request the Congress of the United States amend 21 U.S.C. 661 (a) to allow for interstate shipment of all state inspected meats.

Resolved, That the senate chief clerk shall provide copies of this joint resolution to the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives of the United States and to each of the senators and representatives from Wisconsin
